Please read this important message from the [UC Student Association \(UCSA\)](#) Board Chair Kevin Sabo regarding an important adjustment to the agenda for the January Board of Directors meeting.

Many of you have been asking why the UCSA resolution on divestment from corporations with a role in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict has been removed from the January Board agenda. Since social media seems to be the best method of disseminating a message widely, I'm going to answer the question here.

At our November meeting at UC Merced, the Board voted to postpone the resolution to give time for members to go back to their associations to solicit input so that they could cast a more informed vote. As of December 20th at our executive retreat, many representatives had indicated they had not taken the question back to their associations, and with the onset of winter break coupled with the timing of the January Board meeting, it seems unlikely that any such solicitation would be able to occur.

That being said, in consultation with the resolution's sponsor and out of consideration of a number of other pressing items that require Board action in January, I've moved the item to the February Board meeting scheduled to occur from February 7-8, 2015 at UC Los Angeles. I understand this item is of special interest to a number of UC communities and assure everyone the Board is well aware of this. We're attempting to ensure that any decision is reached after an extensive dialogue and sincere reflection as to what kind of organization we want the UC Student Association to be.
